# Terry Fox - Celebrating a Canadian Hero



Congratulations to all the RHS students and staff who participated in our 2022 Terry Fox Run on September 26. In 1980, an 18-year old Terry Fox was a student at SFU when he was diagnosed with cancer and had his leg amputated. Terry decided to raise awareness by running a marathon a day in a journey across Canada. He hoped that each Canadian would donate \$1 to help find a cure for others. A recurrence of cancer ended his journey after 143 days and 5,373 kilometres and Terry died at age 22. However, the http://www.terryfox.org is still passionately engaged in fulfilling Terry's legacy and its single mission remains to "fund innovative cancer research". All of our Grade 8 students attended an assembly and watched a short video about Terry Fox, and more than 1230 RHS students and staff were involved in our run at Minoru Park. Thank you to everyone who participated, donated, or supported our annual school-wide Terry Fox Run. Our sincere gratitude goes to Mrs. Kippan and the PE Leadership class for organizing every aspect of this wonderful community-building event. 

## **Term 1 Interim Reports & Parent-Teacher Conferences**



Term 1 Interim Reports will be published electronically on MyEducation BC by 3 PM on Thursday, October 27. (Note, any data viewed online before this date is draft only.). This learning update contains descriptive comments regarding learning progress and/or comments on engagement or social responsibility. The interim provides an early indication of how students are progressing in their classes as well as their attendance record since the start the school year. It is important for parents/caregivers to read the report and discuss it with their teen. Parents/Caregivers with concerns about their child's achievement can book a Parent-Teacher Conference for Wednesday, November 2 (2-4, 5-7 PM) or Thursday, November 3 (2-4 PM). Beginning October 27 at 3:30 PM, parents/caregivers will be able to book short appointments online at <a href="https://rhs.schoolappointments.com/admin/">https://rhs.schoolappointments.com/admin/</a>. The five-minute conferences will take place in-person in our large gym. Note, students will be dismissed at 1 PM on these days, and we will follow an alternate bell schedule.

## **MyEducation BC Portal Accounts for Students and Parents**

All parents and students have access to the MyEducationBC (MyEdBC) PORTAL which provides digital online access to students' school information. With this portal account, parents will be able to view report cards, attendance, and other information about their child(ren). The MyEducationBC application is a secure portal used in all school districts in the province of BC. For parents new to Richmond Secondary School, please read the PARENT PORTAL INSTRUCTIONS posted on our school website for directions on how to login and navigate the Parent Portal. Parents new to Richmond Secondary received an email from "sysadmin@myeducation.gov.bc.ca" inviting them to activate their account. (New students to RHS received a handout at school with the same information and should follow the outlined instructions.). Each parent/guardian has been assigned their own separate account. Parents will need to log into the account in order to set their password and gain access to the portal. Please follow the instructions outlined in the email. 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## **Personal Learning Time (PLT) Every Tuesday and Wednesday**



PLT is valuable instructional time that students have choice over how to spend the time on their learning which includes accessing support during the school day. We believe that PLT will encourage a healthy school-life balance as many students are juggling a busy academic schedule with a number of extra-curricular activities and out-of-school commitments. Every week on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, there is one 60-minute PLT block scheduled each day. Students are reminded to prepare for PLT by organizing their learning plan (What tasks do I have?), setting priorities (What is due first? Will I need help? What takes the longest?), and making a plan (What learning spaces do I sign up for?). It is recommended that students sign up at https://rhs.myweeklyplanner.net/ no later than the Monday before PLT days.

#### **Graduation Assessments 2022-2023**

There are 3 provincial assessments that all students must write as required components of the graduation program:

- GNA 10 Graduation Numeracy Assessment to be written in grade 10
- GLA 10 Graduation Literacy Assessment to be written in grade 10
- GLA 12 Graduation Literacy Assessment to be written in grade 12

This year at RHS, we will be hosting graduation assessments in November, January, and April.

- Oct 31 and Nov 1: Grade 10s will write the GLA 10 (and any grade 11-12 students who have not written)
- January 24-25: Grade 12s will write the GLA 12
- April 25-26: Grade 10s will write the GNA 10 (and any grade 11-12 students who have not written)

There will be an alternate schedule on these assessment days that will see an extended PLT block. <u>CLICK HERE</u> for more information on RHS Graduation Assessments.

## Graduation Literacy Assessment 10 (GLA 10) – October 31 & November 1

On October 31 and November 1, we will host the Graduation Literacy 10 Assessment (GLA 10) for grade 10 students and any grade 11-12 students who have not yet written the assessment. Students must check their assessment date and time and location on the posted schedules. The schedules will be put up around the school and will be posted on the **Richmond - Gr 10-12 Students** MS Teams groups.

We will follow an alternate bell schedule on these days. Please note the following instructions for ALL students on October 31 and November 1:



- Students scheduled for the GLA 10 should arrive by 8:00 AM to their assigned location.
- Grade 8s will report to the large gym in PLT on October 31 for career education learning activities.
- All other grade 8-12 students sign up for a PLT session.




#### **Career Education 8-12**



Career Education is a key part of the curriculum in BC. Grade 8 and 9 students are learning career ideas integrated in all of their classes, and all students will complete 4-credits in Career Life Education and 4-credits in Career Life Connections with a Capstone project as graduation requirements. Students have supplemental online assignments, and additional career education learning opportunities are scheduled on Grad Assessment Days for grade 8-12 students. The goal is to help students reflect on their strengths, interests, and attributes as they grow into thoughtful, balanced, capable and contributing citizens. ## Richmond Secondary – A Safe, Caring, and Inclusive Community

The Ministry of Education's erase - Expect Respect and a Safe Education is all about building safe and caring school communities. The Richmond School District is committed to supporting safe, welcoming, and inclusive schools. At RHS, we genuinely believe that everyone is welcome at our school and all students are expected to demonstrate kindness, care and respect at all times – for themselves, for all others, including those who may appear different, in person and online. Teachers and support staff strive to connect with and get to know their students as individuals, and to address concerning behaviours in a proactive, positive way. We introduce and our camp leaders model our themes of kindness, care and respect with our youngest students at Grade 8 Camp and we revisit these expectations with all students throughout the year. We believe fostering a caring community is the best way to prevent intolerance. Strengthening positive connections between students and staff and building a sense of belonging at our school remain important school-wide goals. Students who belong to a club, team, group or regular activity often develop a deeper sense of caring for each other and for the school. It is crucial that parents remain involved in their teenage children's life and are aware of their friends and social connections, including what they are doing online. If parents have concerns or are noticing changes in their child, they are encouraged to speak with their teen and reach out to an RHS counsellor or administrator if necessary. Not all conflict is bullying and there may be some conflict in high school, as in life, and we also want to help students grow into resilient and capable people. However, any pattern of unwelcome, unkind or aggressive behavior, in person or online, is a serious concern and will never be acceptable at our school. When in doubt, please contact the school. #### 2022 General Local Elections - October 15

On <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 15</u>, residents from 162 municipalities across BC will cast their ballots in the 2022 General Local Elections which are held every four years. The 2022 Richmond Election will elect one Mayor, eight Councillors and seven Richmond School Board Trustees. We encourage students, parents and families to engage in the upcoming municipal election and openly discuss issues that are important to you and your family. Similarly, read and listen to news stories from multiple sources. Be a critical thinker and discuss both sides to all issues – are the campaign slogans, promises and rhetoric accurate? It's not too late to register! To register on voting day, eligible resident electors are required to show two pieces of identification, the identification must prove who they are and where they live — including the person's name and residential address. Voting is important – participate in our democracy!

#### **Teens and Halloween**

Halloween is an opportunity for families and children to have fun, create jack-o-lanterns, wear costumes, and go trick-or-treating with their siblings and friends. Hundreds of RHS students and staff will dress up at school. Unfortunately, October 31 can sometimes include large groups of teenagers, igniting fireworks and roaming streets, parks and schoolyards. The results can include personal injury, broken windows, small fires and unnecessary acts of vandalism. Please know that the **RCMP** will be out in large numbers on this night and our school district hires extra security. We strongly encourage parents to speak with their teenage children – find out what their plans are for Halloween – encourage and insist that they behave responsibly or simply stay home and stay safe.
