Inclement Weather Information





- Grade 11s: Report to the Multipurpose room for a career programs presentation on January 22 in PLT 2.
- All other grade 8-12 students sign up for PLT 1 and PLT 2 sessions.

Mental Health #LetsTalk - Friday, January 24



Program Planning & Course Selection for 2025-2026



Richmond Secondary School counsellors will host Grades 8-11 program planning assemblies for RSS students on Thursday, February 6 and students will receive a personalized course selection form, learn about options for courses, graduation requirements and post-secondary pre-requisites to prepare them for choosing their courses for next year. Our timetable and staffing for 2025-2026 is determined based on student enrollment and course requests, so students must select courses carefully, taking into consideration their summer school and online learning plans. It is difficult to make course changes later in the process. Grades 8-11 students will have an opportunity to check and confirm their course selections later in the Students and parents are encouraged to read the online course descriptions, discuss options with their classmates and current teachers, and choose courses thoughtfully. Richmond School Transfer Process

Richmond students who want to apply for a transfer to a school that is outside of their catchment area MUST APPLY TO TRANSFER. This includes out-of-catchment students with a brother or sister currently at a secondary school and students currently in Grade 7 who attend a feeder school but live in another catchment area. Students who are already attending a secondary school out of their catchment area and want to stay, do not have to reapply. The Round 1 Transfer period will be from <u>February 3-28, 2025</u> and these applications are for the 2025-2026 school year. Transfer forms must be submitted to the school you are applying to, on or before <u>February 28</u>. Out-of-catchment students in grade 10 applying to the IB Diploma Programme <u>do not</u> have to submit a school transfer form. (IB applications were due Friday, January 10.)



Governor General's Academic Bronze Medal

Congratulations to **Ethan Li** for being awarded the Governor General's academic bronze medal as the top student in Richmond Secondary School's graduating class of 2024. Ethan earned the highest combined grade 11 and 12 scholastic average out of 264 students in the graduating class.

"For more than 125 years, the Governor General's Academic Medals have recognized the outstanding scholastic achievements of students in Canada. They are awarded to the student graduating with the highest average from a high school, as well as from approved college or university programs. Pierre Trudeau, Tommy Douglas, Kim Campbell, Robert Bourassa, Robert Stanfield and Gabrielle Roy are just some of the more than 50 000 people who have received the Governor General's Academic Medal as the start of a life of accomplishment."
